REPORTING TO PARENTS

Parent interviews are held during Term One and students and parents can participate in Learning Journeys at the end of Term 3. A formal report will also be sent home at the end of Terms 2 and 4 to students in Year 1-6. Kindergarten and Pre Primary will also receive a formal report at the end of Term 2 and 4.

NAPLAN (Year 3 & 5 students) results are also sent home when they are received. We encourage parents to request interviews at any stage throughout the year.

NEWSLETTERS

During each term Newsletters are issued on the basis of one per family from Kindergarten to Year 6. Parents should ensure that they receive a newsletter on the appropriate day and **keep them in a folder for reference**. Newsletters will be emailed to all parents with an email address. Any changes in your email please inform the school immediately.

SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR CODE

Parents will be given individual class rules and consequences at the start of the year. The school has a Managing Student Behaviour (MSB) Policy, which rewards positive behaviour and outlines logical consequences for poor behaviour.

ATTENDANCE

By law, students must attend school regularly. Notes must be provided to the class teacher for any absence. A telephone call to the front office will suffice. Late arrival / early pick ups need to be recorded in the student sign in/out book in the front office.

Parents/Carers need to come to the front office to sign the Visitor's Registration Book before wandering around the school grounds/classroom or if on a parent roster. This is a security requirement by the Department of Education.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS:

- Gold & Green school logo polo shirt
- Gold & Green para-silk school logo jacket
- Bottle Green shorts/skirt/skorts
- Bottle Green pants
- Bottle Green or Black tights/stockings (not leggings)
- School dress (green and white check)
- Appropriate footwear at all times (no ugg boots, thongs, ballet flats or heels)
- No slogans or multi-coloured designs on any garments

ADVICE TO STUDENTS ON DRESS CODE:

- Wide brim or school logo hats must be worn outdoors during Terms One and Four. No caps are allowed as they do not provide adequate sun protection. If the appropriate hat is not worn in Terms One and Four, the student will be restricted to the undercover or veranda areas during breaks.
- Hats should not be worn inside.
- No hoodies.
- Make-up is not permissible at school.
- Long hair must be tied back.
- Year 6 leaver's jumpers/shirts are acceptable uniform.
- For safety reasons any item of jewellery, with the exception of ear studs, sleepers and watches, **should not** be worn at school.

LOST PROPERTY

Please ensure that all clothing, including bathers, towels, hats and shoes are clearly labelled. Lost property is stored and is periodically put on display for retrieval.

LUNCHEES from Dumbleyung Roadhouse THURSDAY only

Students wishing to purchase their lunch from the Roadhouse should place their orders with the class teacher by 9am or put in the tray in the Office where they will be taken to the Roadhouse. Orders should be written clearly on the form provided and placed in an envelope with the correct money. (Please ensure that envelopes are tightly sealed or taped to prevent loss of money.) Spare order forms will be available from the lunch desk outside the office. In the event of food prices being altered, parents will be notified in advance. A school lunch order form must be used for all school lunches.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

Assemblies are held throughout the year in the Library at 2.45pm. Parents and community members are most welcome to attend. Classes and the Student Council take turns running the Assemblies. Assembly dates will be announced via the school newsletter.

SCHOOL USE AFTER HOURS

Cricket or football on the oval, after school hours is encouraged. Students and community are asked however, to keep well away from the school buildings after home time. In this way they will not be questioned about loss or damage to school property.

HEALTH

SCHOOL BUSES

Two buses service the school. Applications must be made to School Bus Services at www.schoolbuses.wa.gov.au. Any queries relating to the buses please ring the Principal or go on line.

Bus safety drills will be conducted regularly to remind children of the safest way to travel in their school bus. If a child has to be driven more than 4.5km to the nearest bus route or school by the shortest practicable route, then a conveyance allowance is payable to the parent.

SCHOOL BUS NOTES – An explanation note or phone call to the office is essential for bus students if alternative arrangements have been made other than bus transportation after school.

Complimentary School Bus travel forms (for after school visiting) are available at the office, no student is to travel on buses without this form being filled out. Parents need to contact the bus driver concerned first if there will be room for any extra passengers.
