Safe-4-Kids PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOURS

On Friday we were lucky enough to have Holly-Ann Martin come in an give multiple lessons on Protective behaviours. Holly-Ann gave amazing lessons on consent, safety networks, warning signs and cyber safety. The students were engaged and asked critical and essential questions

The start of the day focused on saying 'NO is NO'. Reminding students that they have choices. Students also discussed safe people in the school and community, and how they need to use specific vocabulary when explaining issues that may cause them distress.

Holly-Ann also called the kids helpline to show students the process and explained all the ways they can help. The day ended with talks about cyber safety, including cyber bullying and how to report and prevent it. Students were also shocked about how easy it can be to become addicted to technology, and how it affects your mental and physical health.

We would like to thank Holly-Ann for her time and vital information.

Thursday night Mrs Ball, parents and Chappy were privileged to hear Holly-Ann talk about protective behaviours. This is a sensitive and serious subject and was delivered in a relaxed and open forum. Some of the topics included;

- -We all have the right to feel safe all the time.
- -Early warning signs.
- -Public and private parts.
- -Saying no.
- -What to do when feeling unsafe/uncomfortable.
- -How to respond if you become aware of inappropriate online activity. -How to access the KIDS HELP LINE

It was valuable to learn the "why" as well as the "what" topics would be discussed with the children on the Friday, and how the school and Holly-ann's program are developing 'Student Voice.' When we know the "why" of something the "what" makes more sense. We all left feeling more confident and empowered to talk about this with our children. Thank you, Holly-Ann, we will see you again!
