Izayah - "I liked the one where you pulled yourself up."



and excitement for our trip to SciTech! Finally, the day had arrived and we met bright and early at school to pile onto the bus for a 7.00am departure from school. We couldn't decide who was more excited, the students, the teachers or the parent volunteers. It was a **long** drive to SciTech, particularly for the students from the ECE Junior Room, but after several students had asked "how much longer?" and "are we there yet?" we arrived at SciTech full of excitement and



ready to explore!

The first stop was the Planetarium. It looked just like a cinema but instead of showing a movie we got to watch a tour of the night sky and outer space. We learned all about constellations and why they have such interesting names. The presenter then zoomed further and further into outer space until we had seen all the stars, planets and moons in our entire galaxy. We even saw all of the galaxies in the entire universe! Apparently, there could be up to two trillion galaxies in the universe! Fascinating and unfathomable!

After leaving the planetarium we then entered the main SciTech building which had loads of interesting games and activities that tested our scientific thinking. There were so many exhibits but some of our favourites are listed below; We wrote messages and loaded them into a tube and then jumped up and down on a platform to propel the messages through the tube.



We used teamwork skills to drive a hot air balloon simulation and land it safely on the ground.

We explored the inside of a rocket and felt what it would be like to travel through the Earth's atmosphere in a rocket.

We looked at insects under a microscope and saw what their features look like up close. We used our body heat to create an electric current that looked like little bolts of lightning.

We sat on a chair that was suspended by a pulley and used our muscles to pull our own body weight up as high as we could.

We even saw the inside of a beehive and got to watch a colony of bees make their honey using pollen that they had collected from in and around Perth.

After thoroughly exploring all of the exhibits that SciTech had to offer, we sat together for lunch and then headed over to the indoor theatre where we were treated to a presentation called *Knowledge By Nature*'. This show explores how we have always lived with nature and the ways in which we have been inspired by plants, animals, and natural forces to make our lives better. We learned about what happens when yeast is activated and also looked at how we have taken the traits of different animals like lizards, frogs and fish and used them to create equipment and technology that we can use in our everyday lives.

After a fun and interactive show we thanked SciTech for having us and then headed back to the bus where we each got given a packet of shapes to eat on the way home. Thanks to Pip Gooding for donating these. After another long drive and a brief stop in Williams we arrived back in Dumbleyung at 5.45pm. Everyone was exhausted but we all thoroughly enjoyed the day. What a fantastic way to end the Term?!

Welcome back to Term 4! We hope you have had a wonderful break and a good rest. Are you all ready for the last term before the six weeks holidays?






Year 5 /6 Camp 2023
